

SPEAKER: So we talked about the types of uterine fibroids, the common presentation, medical, and surgical options, and as well as a hysterectomy for those who do desire definitive surgery. As I mentioned, we have a comprehensive fibroid center here. That's the website for it. And we are always happy to see patients there.

We see patients both at Mount Zion and at Mission Bay for the fibroid center, and we have a very close relationship with the radiologists. So generally, if someone's interested in one of the interventional radiology procedures, they'll see us first. We'll talk to them, go for options.

If they need any additional testing-- sometimes when women have abnormal urine bleeding, we'll do an endometrial biopsy to make sure that the bleeding is related to the fibroids and not related to something else that would be concerning that should be managed differently.

And the interventional radiologists always need an MRI before they're seen, because that helps them to decide what procedure is best and whether, for example, a uterine artery embolization would be appropriate or could be done. So usually once they see us, we'll get an MRI for them. They'll see one of the interventional radiologists. And then depending on what they are interested in doing, we work very closely with each other for that. So thank you so much for your time.
