SPEAKER 1: What should we do with a patient on a statin? On a well-dosed statin with an LDL of about 70 who develops a new ACS or a new stent thrombosis or things like that, I think the lower, the better. If you look at all they say, I think you should give, on top of the statin, this drug from the orlistat trial.

And that's not uncommon-- patients with a low LDL getting a recurrent ACS, because it's a thrombotic condition. And it is unclear so far, although there is very small data that PCSK9 inhibitors also inhibit platelet function. But that is a laboratory finding. We do not know whether this is real in patients.
