

**SPEAKER:** Yes. The simple answer is yes. The complicated answer is that every senior legislation in Europe has their own cutoffs and criteria. In our country, there are levels of cutoffs for which you must qualify. There is always an extra pathway to those patients who have diagnosed familial hypercholesterolemia.

They usually get reimbursement just right away. But the classic coronary heart disease patient, post myocardial infarction, or post several stent implantations-- one will have to look very carefully whether that reimbursement criteria are fulfilled or not. And I hope, and I'm pretty sure, that these are prone to change over time because the insight into the necessity of intensifying cholesterol therapy is there.
