

SPEAKER 1: That is a controversial topic. And there is not universal agreement even in the areas where the specific guidelines have been promoted. So it's a hot topic.

The earlier treatment is hoped to be preventative. There is some supporting evidence of that. There was a study done with the lead author being Tun Del that looked at early treatment with each party, and found that early treatment with high dose ERT resulted in more complete clearance. And in a few patients, in complete clearance of the kidneys. But if you waited until you had evidence of kidney disease to start treatment, you did not get a clearance of the [INAUDIBLE] and therefore had some risk for progression of the kidney disease, even with aggressive or optimized treatment. And that study actually is the basis for the more aggressive stance that has been held in the United States.
